The United Indian Anthropology Forum (UIAF) is a dynamic and interactive platform to bring together Anthropologists engaged in different fields in India. It came into being to protest against the undemocratic and unilateral decision of the IUAES Executive to shift the venue of the World Congress 2023 from KISS, Bhubaneswar to somewhere else. Many right-thinking Anthropologists formed a WhatsApp group on 7th August 2020 in a bid to generate and mobilize opinion in favour of holding the Congress at KISS. This movement, initiated to right a wrong, assumed in a short time the larger purpose of establishing an academic forum, namely The United Indian Anthropology Forum (UIAF). Eventually, the Forum got registered on 18th November 2020. It is now a vibrant composite of experienced as well as young, promising anthropologists. It promises to offer a very inclusive and vibrant space for the exchange of ideas and thoughts of all hues – conservative and classical on the one



hand and progressive and radically new on the other. The outcome of this exercise which the UIAF envisages will be opening new areas of interdisciplinary research and making Anthropology more meaningfully grounded in the richly variegated cultural terrain of India and the world over. Learned invited lectures, panel discussions and symposiums which the UIAF has been organizing will catalyse the growth and vitalization of Anthropology not just as a discipline, but as a new epistemic force.

When we all forged ahead in a spirited manner, we suddenly lost Professor Vinay Srivastava, one of the distinguished Anthropologists of India. During the formative stage, Professor Srivastava used to give me many useful tips for making the UIAF more vibrant. The COVID pandemic claimed such a fine scholar and nice human being. His wonderful lecture on "Multiculturalism" on UIAF platform will be ever remembered by us. Even as we feel his deep loss, we will cherish him in our memory and continue to feel inspired by his great work.

The World Anthropological Congress 2023 is going to be hosted by the Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences (KISS) Deemed-to-be-University partnering with the United Indian Anthropology Forum and in collaboration with the Departments of Anthropology of three universities, namely the University of Delhi, Sambalpur University, Odisha, and Utkal University Odisha. This momentous event is slated for 15-19 January 2023. The ensuing World Anthropological Congress will be an energetic beginning of the UIAF in its journey into a richer realm of Anthropological studies and consolidation of an academically rewarding fraternity. Please come forward to be part of UIAF and give your scholarly inputs by becoming a registered member of UIAF.

It includes budding, young, senior, and veteran anthropologists across different areas of specializations, and coming from all regions of India. The UIAF has been envisaged as an online community that strives for an enriching exchange of views and consolidation and application of knowledge.

Vision and Mission: The UIAF functions with a vision to pursue anthropology as a way of life, reach out and engage with the people, search for truth, respect diversity, impress upon peoplecentred governance, uphold humanism, and be a catalyst for positive change.

The UIAF is intended to provide a unique platform, mainly through virtual mode, with an inclusive and participatory approach, for the reinforcement of anthropological approaches and perspectives in the contextual and culture-specific understanding of the everyday human experience by focusing on the following tasks:

- Popularizing and promoting the discipline of anthropology at the institutional level
- Enhancing the career prospects, and establishing the identity of anthropology on firmer grounds and facilitating the exchange of views and ideas among anthropological fraternity
- > Encouraging debates and discussions on the emerging facets of knowledge
- Creating and disseminating anthropological knowledge
- > Acting as a training ground for the translation of this knowledge into policy formulations and practical applications for a better human society and environment

Thus, the UIAF is envisaged to play a proactive role in accomplishing its disciplinary commitment to its mission and revitalising Anthropology across India.

Origin and Context: The need for a Forum came up in the context of a call to the Anthropology Fraternity in India for upholding the spirit and tenets of Anthropology, responding to the crisis of sorts concerning the

organisation of the World Anthropology Congress 2023 in India. In the process, two distinct groups of Anthropologists namely the Senior and the Young Anthropologists emerged. only to be joined with a third group of Practising Anthropologists, and later by a group of budding anthropologists, all becoming active in the What's App social media. The different Anthropology Associations and Organisations in India had also joined to lend their support in a unison voice to come out of the crisis. The interactions among the members of the group led to the idea of the formation of a United Indian Anthropology Forum. This was followed by a process of inviting anthropologists to the Forum from all across India for online registration. Though it sprang up spontaneously over a particular crisis, it brought together not only the individual Anthropologists across India but also the existing Anthropological Associations ultimately emerging as a vibrant academic forum. Thus, the crisis that led to the idea of the Forum was a blessing in disguise to unite the Indian Anthropologists across specialisations, regions, and age groups for a just cause which, during a short span of time, has emerged as a proactive Anthropological to go beyond the immediate target of organising the World Anthropology Congress 2023 (WAC 2023).

The UIAF is cognizant of the existing anthropological bodies at various levels and acknowledges their immense contribution in promoting research and academic excellence. We wish to partner with them in the pursuit of their stated objectives. Common concern for all of us is to play a fundamental and constructive role in strengthening anthropological identity and in popularising the subject. This Forum professes to maintain its autonomy at the

national level while building bridges with all other existing platforms. This is indeed crucial for the rejuvenation of the discipline. The ideological purpose is to realize the true potential of the discipline by raising a collective voice in unison for the overall cause of Indian Anthropology.

- ➤ We have Four Categories of Members as given below along with their subscription fee. The Age is the 'completed years' as on 1 January 2021.
 - 1. Senior Veteran (70 years or above) Subscription Fee Nil
 - **2.** Senior (50 years or above or a Professor even if below 50 years) INR 1500/-
 - **3.** Young (Between 30 and 49 years and those professionally employed even if less than 30 years) INR 1000/-
 - **4.** Budding (Below 30 years and those not professionally employed even if 30 years or above) INR 250/-

- > Those who register on or before the given date as notified in the Forum Website would qualify to become the Founding Members of the Forum.
